| Bluff | NW | named for the large rocks on Bluff Mountain, PO in operation 1897-1905 (Newell) |
| Bobo | NW | first appears on the 1960 edition of the county highway map |
| Boley Springs | SE | PO in operation 1877-1887 (Smith) |
| Boones Mill | 97-SE | appears on a map dating from 1917 |
| Brockton PO | 35-SW | variant for Covin, Brockton PO open 1884-1890 (Foscue) (Smith) |
| Buck Snort PO | 54-SE | in operation 1873-1894 (Newell) |
| Bucksnot | 72-SE | variant for Bankston |
| Byler | 72-SE | variant for Bankston in 1831 |
| Byrds Mill | 13-NW | appears on an 1878 map, also known as Eagles Mill with PO in open 1869-1870 (Smith) |
| Cane PO | 16-NW | in operation 1878-1905 (Newell) |
| Cave Springs PO | 65-SW | variant for Ashcraft Corner, PO open 1856-1866, 1871-1887, 1888-1894 (Newell) |
| Cedar Hill | SW | first appears on the 1960 edition of the county highway map |
| Clear Creek PO | 53-SE | established in 1835, became Harveys Crossroads PO in 1839 (Newell) |
| Cleveland | SE | community around a chapel found on a map dating from 1917 |
| Cole Bluff PO | 28-NE | in operation 1893-1907 (Smith) |
| Concord | SE | named for the Revolutionary War battle site in Concord, Massachusetts (Foscue) |
| Coosa | 46-SW | appears on a map dating from 1937 |

| Covin | SW | first Brockton in 1884, then Tallula 1890-1892, Covin PO 1892-1958 (Foscue) (Smith) |
| Dardons Mill | 95-SE | also known as Freemans Mill, Dardons Mill on a map dating from 1911 |

| Gum Bud | 91-SW | a Baptist church here was established in 1896 (Newell) |
