


Cornelius	149 - SE	T13S, R1E, Sec 2	William Cornelius Family Cemetery; named for Revolutionary War veteran William <i>Cornelius</i> (d. 1842); first known interment: Lettice <i>Cooke</i> (1797-1829); the stone of a child, Rufus D. <i>Waid</i> (d. 1834) is also found among approximately 15 weathered stones (15)
